## **Indicators of Child Abuse**

- **I.** Consider the possibility of *physical abuse* when the child:
  - has unexplained burns, bites, bruises, broken bones, or black eyes;
  - has fading bruises or other marks noticeable after an absence from school or play activities;
  - seems frightened of the parents screams cries or protest when it is time to go home from school or the play activity;
  - shrinks at the approach of adults, or;
  - reports injury by the parent of another care giver;
  - has repeated injuries over a period of time;
  - has untreated injuries;
  - wears extra layers of clothing that are not appropriate for the season.
- II. Consider the possibility of neglect when the child:
  - appears less than normal height and weight over a period of time this is referred to as failure to thrive;
  - is frequently absent from school or play activities;
  - begs or steals food or money from classmates;
  - lacks needed medical, dental care, immunizations, or glasses;
  - is consistently dirty and has severe body odor;
  - lacks sufficient clothing for the weather;
  - abuses alcohol or other drugs, or;
  - the child states there is no one at home to provide care.
- III. Consider the possibility of sexual abuse when a child:
  - has difficulty walking or sitting;
  - suddenly refuses to change for gym or to participate in other physical activities;
  - demonstrates sexual knowledge inappropriate for their age group;
  - becomes pregnant or contracts a venereal disease especially when under the age of 13;
  - has Injury to the genitals;
  - has bodily fluid stains on clothing or body;
  - regresses to earlier developmental stages; or
  - is a runaway
- VI. Consider the possibility of emotional abuse when the child:
  - shows extremes in behavior such as overly compliant or demanding behavior, extreme passivity or aggression;
  - is either inappropriately adult (parenting other children for example) or inappropriately infantile (frequently rocking or head banging for example);
  - is delayed in physical or emotional development;
  - has attempted suicide, or; reports a lack of attachment to parent.
