
GROW

SERVE

Serve helps us fulfill Christ's mandate to love one another, help those in need, and make new disciples. We focus on three areas: food/hunger, housing/shelter and children/ youth. In 2013 CUMC gave over \$8000 during our Alternative Gifts in December, 176 Thanksgiving meals to Project Share and made over 45 blankets for CARES. Each week, 8-12 kids are tutored at Safe Harbour. 46 youth & adults have gone on mission trips, and 330 meals have been served at the Salvation Army. We have 150 people serving with:

LOCALLY: Safe Harbour, Project SHARE, Salvation Army, Fruitbelt Farm workers, Carlisle CARES, Little Lights Learning Center, The Mentoring Project at YMCA, and local home repairs. NATIONALLY: Mission Central and Disaster Relief Trips

INTERNATIONALLY: Sierra Leone Partnership and Haiti Volunteers in Mission

FINANCIAL SUPPORT: Emergency Assistance Fund and Samaritan Fellowship
